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Advances in Role and Reference Grammar Robert D. Van Valin, Jr., 1992-01-01 This volume presents research on major issues in syntactic theory within Role and Reference Grammar This theory was first presented in detail in *Functional Syntax and Universal Grammar* FSUG and these papers represent both expansions and applications of the theory to a wide range of phenomena The first section contains an introduction to the theory which is the most thorough statement of it since FSUG summarizing the features of Role and Reference Grammar established there and developing new theoretical components and analyses of syntactic phenomena not discussed in the earlier work Throughout the discussion features of RRG are compared and contrasted with comparable features of other syntactic theories The remainder of the volume is devoted to detailed analyses of specific problems e g control case marking in a wide variety of languages e g Mandarin Chinese Nootka Mparntwe Arrernte and Turkish Thus the works presented here illustrate well the strong cross linguistic approach to syntactic theory and description in Role and Reference Grammar

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New Perspectives in Role and Reference Grammar Wataru Nakamura, 2011-09-22 *New Perspectives in Role and Reference Grammar* presents a broad picture of current developments in Role and Reference Grammar RRG a version of parallel structure grammar with an emphasis on typological adequacy Since its inception RRG has been applied to a wide range of languages in particular to case marking complex clauses e g control raising and serial verb constructions unaccusativity unergativity and the interplay between syntax and information structure The present book is a continued investigation of the intermodular correspondence in a variety of languages and comprises 13 papers which not only contribute to the further development of the theory but also investigate controversial areas of linguistic theory including inflectional and derivational morphology verbal semantics and argument structure anticausative and serial verb constructions the argument adjunct distinction an extended typology of complex clauses the syntax information structure interface and interactions between the lexicon and constructions In addition three papers illustrate how RRG may be applied to sign languages language acquisition and machine translation from Arabic to English

The Grammar of the English Tense System ,2008-08-22 The Grammar of the English Tense System forms the first volume of a four volume set The Grammar of the English Verb Phrase The other volumes to appear over the next few years will deal with mood and modality aspect and voice The book aims to provide a grammar of tense which can be used both as an advanced reference grammar for example by MA level or postgraduate students of English or linguistics and as a scientific study which can act as a basis for and stimulus to further research It provides not only a wealth of data but also a unique framework for the study of the English tense system which achieves great predictive and explanatory power on the basis of a limited number of relatively simple rules The framework provided allows for an analysis of the semantics of individual tenses which reflects the role of tenses not only in locating situations in time relative to speech time but also in relating situations in time relative to one another to form temporally coherent discourse Attention is paid to the relations between tenses On the one hand we can identify sets of tenses linked to particular temporal areas such as the past or the future These sets of tenses provide for the expression of a system of temporal relations in a stretch of discourse in which all the situations are located within the same temporal area On the other hand there are many contexts in which speakers might in theory choose between two or more tenses to locate a situation e g when we choose between the past tense and the present perfect to locate a situation before speech time and the book examines the difference that a choice of one or the other tense may make within a discourse context The book moves from a detailed exploration of the meaning and use of individual tenses to a thorough analysis of the way in which tenses can be seen to function together as sets and finally to a detailed examination of tenses in and tenses interacting with temporal adverbials Original data is used frequently throughout the book to illustrate the theory discussed

Foundations of English Grammar Xavier Dekeyser,Betty Devriendt,Guy August Juliaan Tops,Stefaan Geukens,2008 As its subtitle puts it Foundations of English grammar is intended for university students and advanced learners Thus it positions itself between grammars for the general public which must shy away from calling on linguistic concepts and major scholarly descriptions of English which are definitely beyond the grasp of someone without previous linguistic knowledge Foundations does not presuppose that it explains all the linguistic concepts it uses But since it is primarily intended for university students these concepts are fairly sophisticated and they come from a wide range of linguistic schools Foundations is neither a contrastive grammar systematically comparing English with Dutch nor a normative one though it will signal disputed usages that are current It is a descriptive grammar of modern living English concentrating on British English with brief discussions of important American English features In this sixth edition eight chapters have been revised some very extensively roughly those on the noun phrase on verbal complementation and on the complex sentence New grammatical concepts have been introduced and others have been defined more sharply most obviously in chapter zero which explains the basic framework but elsewhere as well When possible explanations have been simplified when necessary they have been made more precise Recent changes in the English language have been accounted for in grammar as well as in usage A noticeable change in all revised chapters is that the examples many of which had to be made up in the pre computer age are now all real life examples culled mainly from the world wide web Though conceived first and foremost as a textbook Foundations has always been and remains eminently serviceable as a reference grammar thanks to its detailed tables of contents each chapter has its own its extensive index and its many cross references
